# **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

1. ENTRIES will be accepted at the Secretary's Office, at the Showgrounds. The Office will be open: Monday 3<sup>th</sup> March 2025 to Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2025 (10.00am to 1.30pm); Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2025 to Friday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2025 (9:00am to 5:00pm); SHOW DAY (All Day). The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society ([www.oakeyshowsociety.com](http://www.oakeyshowsociety.com)). **See relevant Show sections for closure times for entries.**
2. Competitors shall endeavor to send a detailed list of articles they intend to submit for competition. The list should be delivered to the Secretary as per the Show Schedule. Each article on delivery should be correctly labeled with Section and Class details. Entry fees must accompany entries. No refunds will be allowable on any entry that is not exhibited.

Entries for the **Horse Section** can be purchased at the Horse Ring Tent on Show Day, OR entries can be submitted and paid for online through 'Showday Online'- <https://showday.online>

**All entries made via Showday Online must be paid for at the time of booking using a bank transfer.**

**For previous users of 'Showday Online'** -log in and enter your username and password.

**For new users of 'Showday Online'**- create an account first.

**NO** refunds.

3. Exhibits will be received in accordance with the regulations set out in this schedule.
4. **No exhibitor will be allowed to remove, or in any way interfere with any exhibit until 4.00pm Saturday of the Show, unless with permission from the Steward concerned.**
5. Agricultural, Horticultural, Produce, Home Cooking, Needlework and Handcraft must be grown or made by the exhibitor.
6. No person shall act as judge over exhibits in any class which he/she is an Exhibitor.
7. The Judge's decision is final, but in the event of a protest, such protest shall be lodged in writing within half an hour of the event, with the Secretary. \$50.00 to accompany protest which will be refunded if protest is upheld.
8. The Judge may award a second or third prize instead of a first, if exhibits are not of sufficient merit.
9. No person, without the permission of the Chief Steward, shall be permitted inside the pavilion on judging day.
10. Where exhibits bear the name of an exhibitor or manufacturer, the name is to be carefully covered until judging is over.
11. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry into the grounds to any exhibit where there is reason to expect that it is diseased or dangerous. The Committee also reserves the right to remove such an entry from the grounds.
12. No award ribbon, other than those awarded at the Show shall be placed on any exhibit whilst in the Showgrounds, without the prior approval of the Steward for the section in which it is entered.
13. PRIZE MONEY will be paid in cash and may be collected from the Secretary's Office on Saturday of the Show. Any prize money not collected at the Show will revert to the credit of the Society.
14. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property of the Show Society, but the exhibits will not be insured at a cost to the Society.
15. **Fire Ants-** In Queensland, the Biosecurity Act 2014 requires everyone to take reasonable steps to prevent the spread of fire ants. Exhibitors of horses, beef cattle, Angora Goats or potted plants are reminded that Biosecurity Rules need to be followed to exhibit at the Oakey Show.  
Anyone bringing *hay, straw, chaff, silage or potted plants* from Queensland Fire Ant Zones to and from the Oakey Showgrounds must comply with the current Queensland fire ant movement requirements.

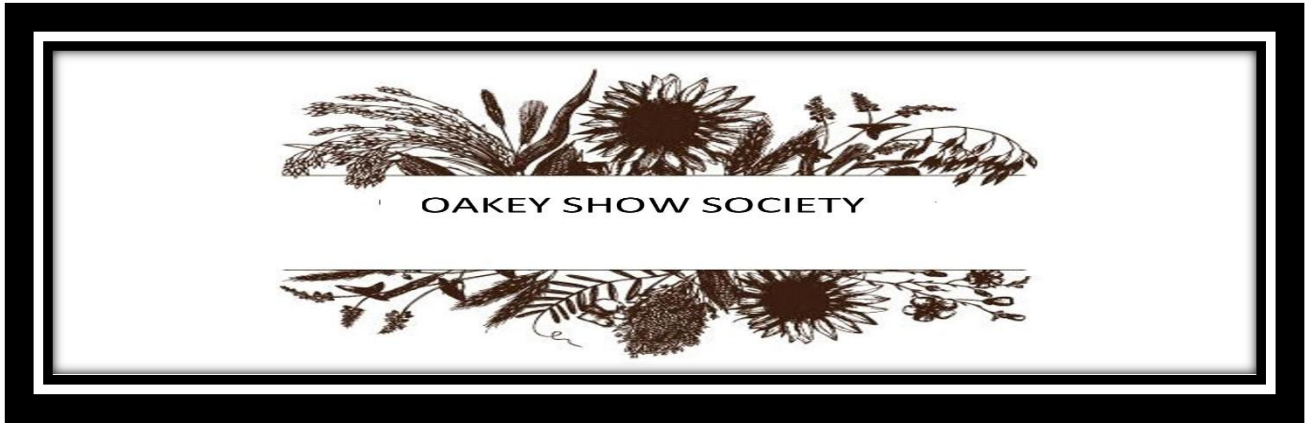

Important notes for all competitors:

• QCAS mandatory requirements state that Horse Health Declarations be completed for all horses attending QCAS affiliated Agricultural Shows and other equestrian events organised and run by show societies. It is therefore a

requirement of the Oakey Show that the Horse Health Declarations and Competitor Waiver Forms are completed and handed in at the Horse Ring Tent, where you will receive your competitor's wrist band. These forms must be completed prior to the riding/handling of horses on the showgrounds on Show Day.

- Horse Ring Entry Tickets can be purchased after receipt of your competitor's wristband. All entries will be taken via the Southern Horse Ring Gate.
- The Horse Health Declarations can be found at the end of Section A Horses within this schedule.
- The declarations are required to be held on file by the Show Society for 2 years after the date of the horse event.
- All horses on the showgrounds, whether competing on the day or not, need to be included on the declaration. **The Society runs under QCAS rules and regulations at all times.**
- All horses and ponies must be registered in respective breeds to compete. Papers are to be available to view in all breed classes.
- Local Classes – Horses and riders must reside within 30km of the Oakey Showground.
- Ponies must not exceed 14 hands.
- Galloway Hacks shall be over 14 hands and NE 15 hands.
- Stallions are not permitted to compete in Hack classes.
- Judge's decision is final. All protests must be in writing, with the fee of \$50.00 and forwarded to the Secretary within 30 minutes of the class finishing.
- In the event of a tie, prize money will be shared.
- Competing horses must be drug free and sound. Random drug swabbing may occur.

- Stallions are to have bits in their mouth at all times. Age limit on handlers.
- Horses are either Show Horse or Show Hunter. They cannot compete in both except where stated.
- All riders must wear protective helmets that are to Australian Standard.
- For safety, all handlers must wear suitable footwear when leading horses.
- Bullying is an issue in many sports today. The Oakey Show Society wishes to advise that it will not be accepted in any form at our show.
- All tickets to be completed with horse's name, owner and address details before entering ring.
- A Maiden Hack is a Hack that has not won a Maiden Class in competition at any affiliated show. After winning a Maiden Hack Class, this horse will be recognized as a Novice.
- A Novice Hack is a Hack that has not won a Champion at an affiliated show. After winning a Champion Hack, this horse will be recognized as Open.
- The age of a competitor is determined as at the first day of the show. The age of all horses is calculated as at 1st August. Newcomer - not to have started under saddle before 1/7 of the previous year.

# NATIONAL CATTLE HEALTH DECLARATION EXPLANATORY NOTES

## OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer.

Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document e.g. Johne’s disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at: [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements)

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

## QUESTIONS 3 & 4: BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA VIRUS (PESTIVIRUS) TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal’s life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Dairy cattle may be tested through bulk milk testing. Contact your veterinarian for assistance. Producers who don’t know the answer to these questions should tick the ‘N’ box.

## QUESTION 5: JOHNE’S DISEASE TESTING

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

**Check test** – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. An ELISA test is available but is not recommended and also not accepted for entry of cattle to WA.

**Sample test** – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. See note above for ELISA test.

**Herd Environmental Culture (HEC) Check Test** (for dairy cattle) – a test of a representative sample of faecal material from the yard (see JD in [Cattle Definitions & Guidelines](#) for details). Details are available at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools).

## QUESTIONS 6 & 7: JOHNE’S DISEASE

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property(s). Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The **Johne’s Beef Assurance Score** (J-BAS) is a voluntary tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools). The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the ‘JD in cattle’ webpage). The *National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production* provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

The **Johne’s Disease Dairy Score** (JDDS) is a voluntary tool for JD risk profiling in dairy cattle. Information is available at [www.dairyaustralia.com.au/bjd](http://www.dairyaustralia.com.au/bjd)

**Grazing of non-bovine species** – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.

## TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments in the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer’s recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first-time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. - The competition is a test of the dog's jumping ability.
- The competition is open to all dogs and bitches.
- The dog is to jump over the wall; however, the dog can touch any part of the jump to get over the wall.
- There must be a handler at the top of the jump to act as a catcher if necessary, and a handler as a catcher at the bottom.
- The dogs can be encouraged over the jump by a handler, vocally or visually.
- The dogs can remain on the lead during the run up and jumping, however the dogs cannot be assisted by either handler by pushing or pulling the lead or the dog.
- All dogs not jumping must be on a lead, with a handler in the marshalling area away from the jump run area.
- Only one dog may be loose in the competition area at any one time.
- Each dog is allowed three jump attempts at each height, if necessary, until only one dog remains to provide a winner. If more than one dog has jumped the final height a count back on refusals is to be done and the dog with the least refusals will be the winner. If all are equal the prize is shared, with each dog declared joint winners.
- Dogs shall be disqualified if unsuccessful on the 3<sup>rd</sup> attempt.
- Any mishandling or misuse of any dog will incur immediate disqualification.
- Bitches in season are not permitted on the ground.
- If, in the opinion of the stewards, a dog is unsafe to other competitors or the public, it will be withdrawn from the competition.

### For Part A & B

#### 1. Risk Factors:

- The herd contains goats that were born or raised with dairy goats. The herd contains dairy breeds or dairy cross breed goats. Exceptions are goats that are from JDMAP herds.
- The herd has grazed land in the past 5 years that is at risk of Johne's disease (JD) contamination. Land at risk of JD contamination includes land that is being grazed, or has been grazed in the preceding 12 months, by:
  - Dairy breeds or dairy cross bred goats, which are not sourced from JDMAP herds.
  - Goat herds with JD.
  - Dairy cattle with a Johne's Disease Dairy Score of less than 7.
  - Beef cattle with a Johne's Beef Assurance Score of less than 6.
  - Sheep other than from SheepMAP flocks.

**2. Infected but undertaking a Property Disease Management Plan (PDMP):** An infected herd that has not yet completed a PDMP but is complying with an on-farm disease control program combining elements of testing, kid rearing and biosecurity that has been developed by their veterinarian.

**3. Infected or suspected of being infected:** Means infected or suspected of being infected with JD. Herds are no longer regarded as infected or suspected of being infected when a PDMP has been completed in consultation with their veterinarian.

**4. Check Test:** A test of 50 homebred goats over 12 months of age in the herd (or all goats over 12 months of age in smaller herds) by serology or faecal culture or pooled faecal culture of 2 pools each of 25 goats, with negative results. The animals should be selected so as to increase the probability of detecting infection, i.e. older animals, animals in poor body condition.

**5. Approved Vaccinated Goat:** A goat that is:

- Vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age; or
- Vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks, when the flock
  - » was in the JDMAP, or
  - » had undertaken a negative Sample Test by PFC in the 2 years preceding the vaccination; or
  - » is identified as an Approved Vaccinate.

**6. Nationally approved kid rearing plan:** A kid rearing plan designed to minimise the spread of JD in intensively managed herds, which has been documented and agreed by GICA and Animal Health Committee.

**Q8.** Whole herd test - an individual test of all goats using a serological test (CAE ELISA), including the investigation of reactors, or a bulk milk herd test with sampling occurring when most goats are lactating. More details are available at: [animalhealthaustralia.com.au/goatmap](http://animalhealthaustralia.com.au/goatmap)

**Q11.** Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on this and interstate movements of goats, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.

**Q12.** If answered Yes, all animals should have been checked during at least one spread period, and any lameness investigated, with no signs of the disease observed. If answered no, producers can add any information about the disease and their management of it; e.g. whether any testing has been carried out, or what treatments may have been used recently.
